

Proposed KSHSAA Resolution  
April 19, 2010

The membership of KAIRS is committed to the value of high school activities that are free from recruiting athletes. In September 2007, a committee was formed by the Kansas State High School Activities Association (KSHSAA) to study issues of public and private school memberships including the issue of school classification. The recommendations included the following:

“The KSHSAA should maintain the current practice of school classification while continuing the enforcement of all KSHAA rules. The Committee does not recommend the introduction of a weighting, multiplier, or deduction factor in regard to enrollment for classification purposes. The implementation of a weighting/multiplier/deduction factor may be perceived to solve an isolated issue, but may lead to additional issues or concerns.”

“The Committee does not recommend separation of private schools from public schools as it relates to championship completion.”

KAIRS proposes that KSHSAA continues with a compliance committee composed of public and private schools when investigating any allegation of violations of KSHSAA rules by any member of public or private schools. Violations by individual institutions should be sanctioned by KSHSAA.
